What is the STS Community Fund?

A fund that can offer urgent support with awards of \$500 or more to help local residents in crisis. The fund will address much needed short-term, stop gap assistance that can be provided quickly. The Sister Tribe by the Seaside Foundation is #TrulyLocal. We are all residents of Nassau County so we can vet and process requests quicker than large non-profits.

Who will benefit from the Community Fund?

Local residents of Nassau County that have experienced tragedy in some form such as accidents, loss of a home, family member, or other critical situations. In some cases STS may be aware of the need and offer assistance directly and in other cases the requests for help can be applied for online through a form that will be on our website once the fund is established.

Why do we need a Community Fund?

Many of our local residents do not qualify or receive the assistance they need because they are independent contractors, the processing time for other non-profits is too long, or the applications are too complex to complete in time. STS wants to help fill the need so that all residents of Nassau County have access to assistance.

New local nonprofit to benefit Nassau County

Sister Tribe by the Seaside is a new 501(c)(3) nonprofit registered in Florida and based on Amelia Island that is dedicated to supporting our local community in Nassau County. Its tagline #TrulyLocal is a testament to its mission "to unify our community by organizing events that raise money for other local nonprofit organizations as well as helping community members in need," according to its website.

Sister Tribe by the Seaside began as a local women's social group and evolved just this year into a legally registered nonprofit foundation. Sister Tribe by the Seaside Foundation consists of Gina Sue Rowe, president and director of development; Stacy Michele Wootton, secretary and executive director; and Eliza Alys Young, treasurer and creative director. Together, they are excited about benefiting the community they live in.

Just last week, Sister Tribe by the Seaside provided checks for charities from two events this year. \$1,155.21 was raised at the Leprechaun Crawl, which benefited the Nassau County Food Program, and \$822.67 was raised at the Bunny Hop Spring Fling, which benefited the Council on Aging. More exciting events are planned for later this year, including a roaring 20s-themed Bellini Ball, featuring the Swinging Medallions and much more, on Aug. 31 at Sadler Ranch. Monies raised from the Bellini Ball will be used to start our community fund.
